14:00-17:30	<p><b>Field visit to the Information Technology Centre of the Ministry of Justice, Republic of Korea</b></p> <p><i>The Korean Judiciary has been making remarkable strides in terms of efficiency of IT system and its management. Since it took a first step to establish a judicial electronic system in 1979, the Korean Judiciary has sought to enhance justice, uphold the rule of law and improve the public welfare through the means of advanced technology. After three decades of this endeavor, the Supreme Court of Korea now boasts the IT Center which is formed under the National Court Administration of the Supreme Court. The IT Center has a consolidated system with 6,090 servers. Equipped with ultra-modern facilities, the center's 106 officials and more than a thousand of outsourced staffs monitor court administration with an electronic system and control related facilities across the nation. Effective utilization of information technology by the IT Center enabled the Judiciary to be more responsive to the public needs and to work with increased efficiency.</i></p>

For those countries, challenges are more complex and diverse. These challenges may create poor quality regulation which remains a major barrier to entrepreneurship and investment. Korea was one of few countries who managed to mitigate those reform challenges efficiently. In this session, we will learn how they re-built the country after the war in the 1950s and emerged to be one of the Top 20 economies in the world.</i></p>
